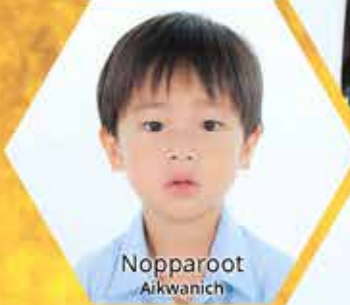

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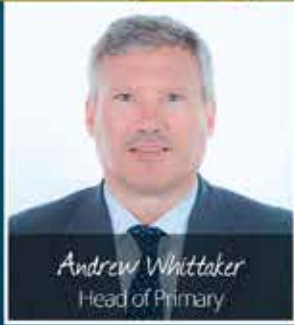
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PRIMARY AWARDS 2016 - 2017

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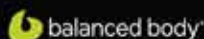
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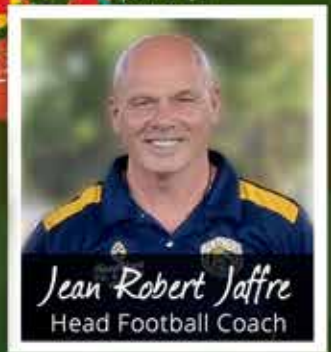
FOOTBALL ACADEMY

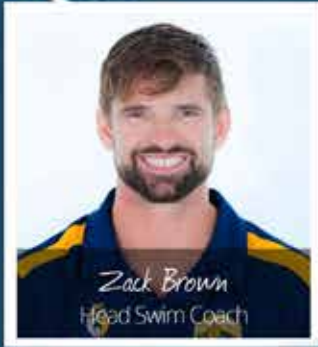

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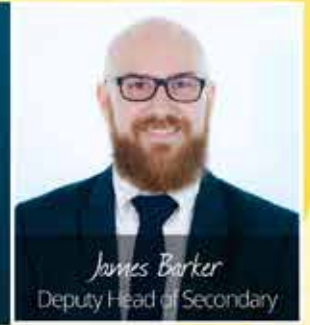

Academic Results



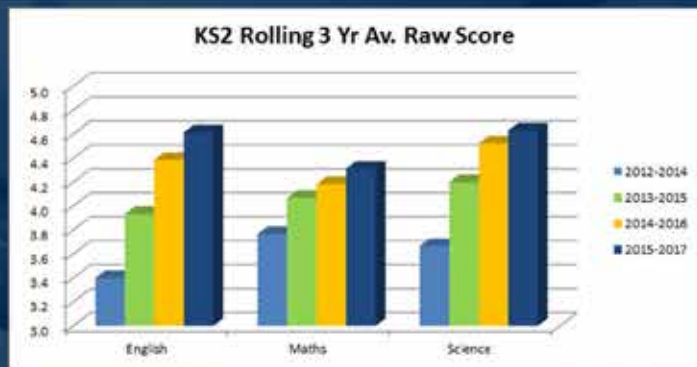

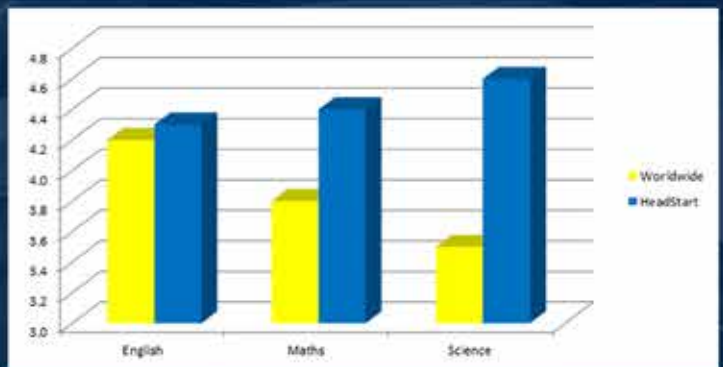

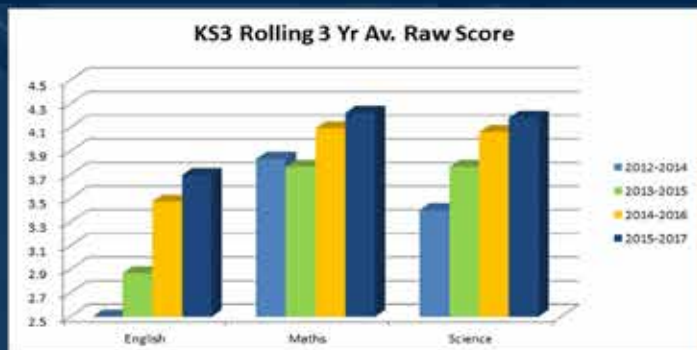
Year 6 Checkpoint Scores



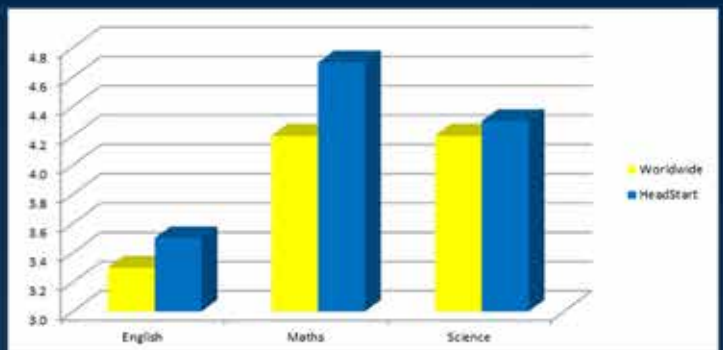
Year 6 Checkpoint Scores HeadStart vs. Worldwide



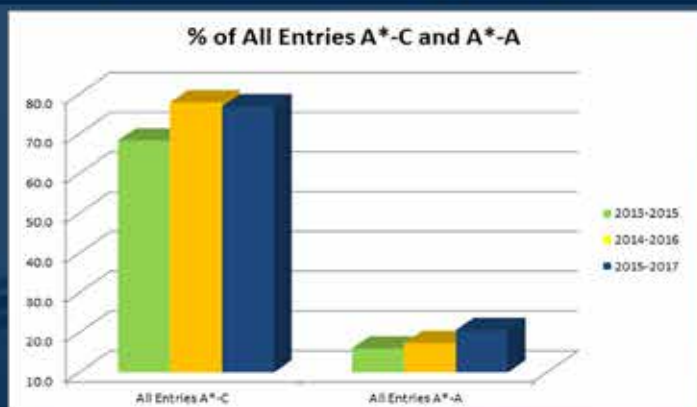
Year 9 Checkpoint Scores



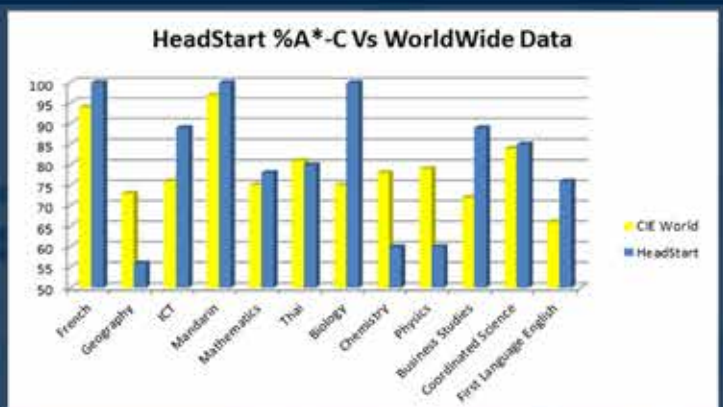
Year 9 Checkpoint Scores HeadStart vs. Worldwide

The World Scholars Cup

HeadStart students travelled to Bangkok in 2016 to participate in the Regional Round of The World Scholar's Cup. The competition has an over-arching theme every year. 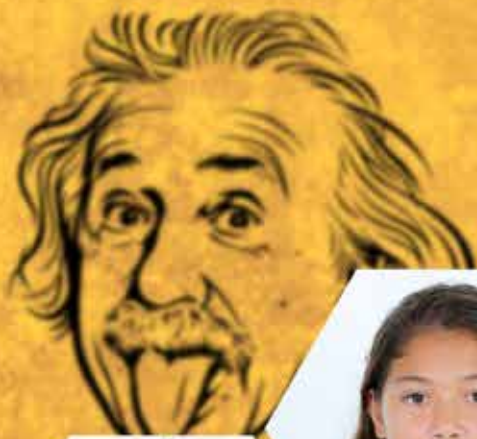


Dear 11 Yellow,

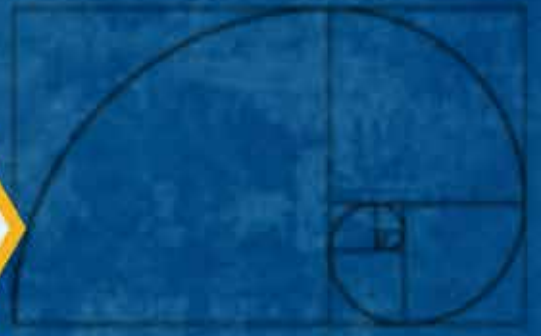

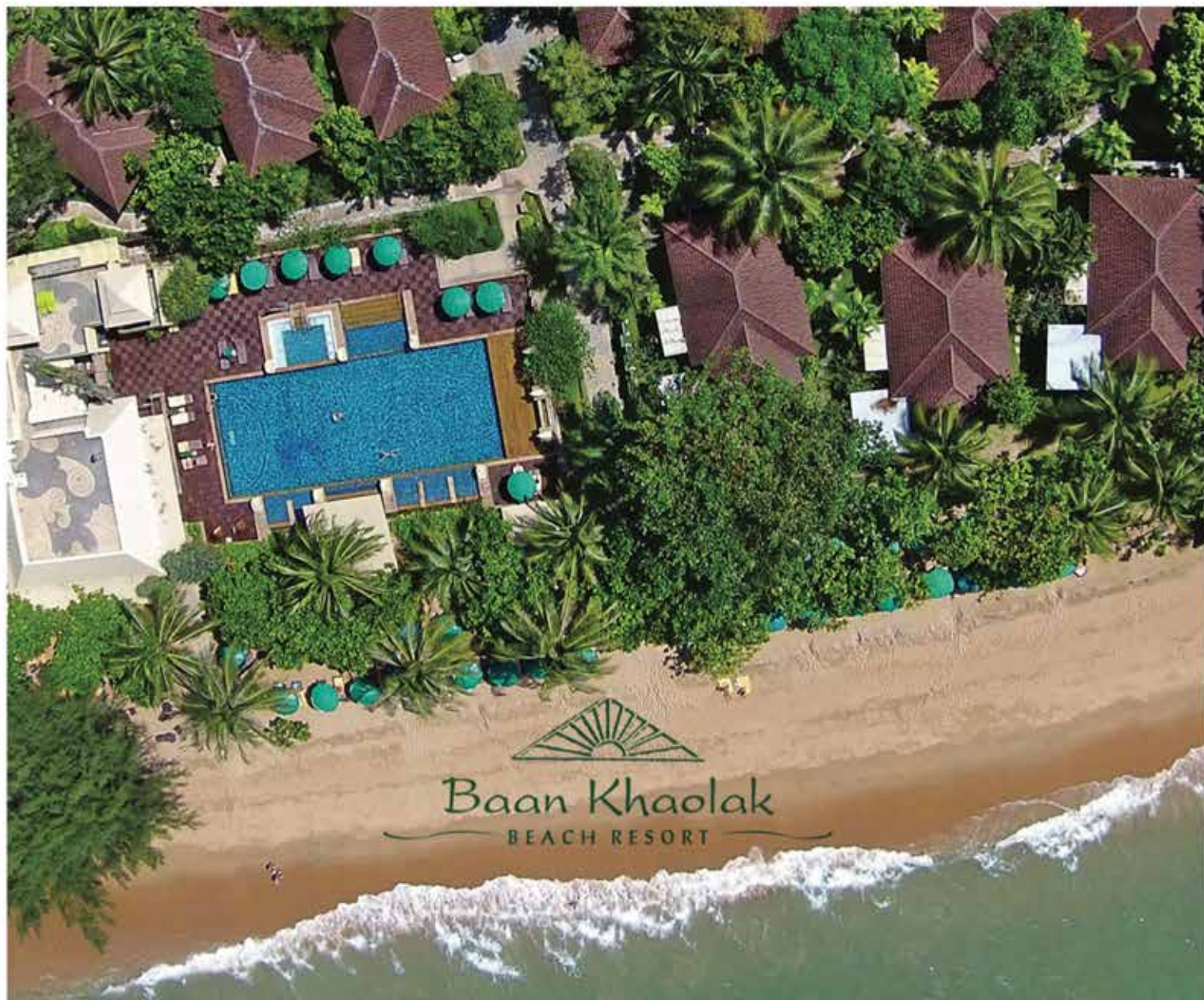

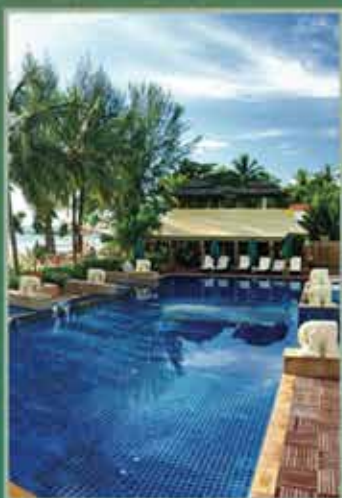
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
