## A MESSAGE FROM OUR HEADMASTER



It has been an amazing year to be part of the HeadStart community, marked by the resumption of many events and activities that were put on hold during the pandemic. With a full programme resuming this year, we have seen the diverse and incredible talents of our students shine through once again against a background of significant growth and expansion.

Academically, as well as an outstanding set of results once again in our Cambridge examinations at IGCSE and A Level, 14 students achieved a total of 15 Cambridge Learner Awards, where students are recognised for achieving the highest scores in their exams in the whole of Thailand. For the first time in our history, one student achieved the highest score in the world! Our students were back in action travelling on many swimming and football trips to compete against some of the best teams in Asia, showcasing their talents and sportsmanship. Our Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) academy once again wowed audiences with their amazing production of Chicago, and we held our first primary show in several years, which was a huge success and wonderful to see more than 200 students take part. We were also excited to launch the CAPA Expo, which showcased the talents of our students across a range of creative disciplines, including music, dance, drama, and visual arts. Design & Technology students in Secondary were tasked with creating designs that promote sustainability. Y7 students created cloth tote bags thus helping to reduce the amount of plastic waste that ends up in oceans & landfills. Y9 used scrap plywood to create pot holders using a laser cutter. By repurposing materials that would otherwise go to waste, the students were able to create functional and attractive products while reducing their environmental impact. The school's Eco Club has been working on creating new sheets for keyring fobs using recycled HDPE and PP plastic.


# MEAR 6 WHITE
